MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This multilateral Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter called as the 'MOU') is entered into on this the 6th day of - September- Two Thousand and Twenty One (6 September 2021).

AND

Tagore Government Arts and Science College, Lawspet, Puducherry- 605008, the Second Party, and represented herein by its Principal Dr. Sasi Kanta Dash (Name of Competent Authority)/ Dr. Beenu Marcus and Dr. Bharti Arora, Assistant Professors of English, Representative, (hereinafter referred to as "Second Party").

AND

Government First Grade College, Vidyanagara, Byndoor, Udupi district, Karnataka, 576 214, the Third Party, and represented herein by its Principal Dr. Raghu Naika, Name of Competent Authority/ Dr. Geethanjali B., Assistant Professor of English, Representative, (hereinafter referred to as "Third Party").

AND

Government First Grade College Bellavi, the Fourth Party, and represented herein by its Principal Prof. Jagadeesh N. H., Name of Competent Authority/ Mr. Shridhar, Assistant Professor of English, Representative, (hereinafter referred to as "Fourth Party").

(First Party, Second Party, Third Party, and Fourth Party are hereinafter jointly referred to as 'Parties' and individually as 'Party') are all public sector Higher Education Institutions (HEIs)

WHEREAS:

- A) All Parties believe that collaboration and cooperation among themselves will promote more effective use of each of their resources, and provide each of them with enhanced opportunities.
- C) The Parties intend to cooperate and focus their efforts on offering certificate and add-on courses that benefit the student community across institutions.
- D) All Parties, being legal entities in themselves desire to sign this MOU for advancing their collective interests with regard to their students.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE COLLECTIVE PROMISES SET FORTH IN THIS MOU, THE PARTIES HERETO AGREE ASFOLLOWS:

CLAUSE I CO-OPERATION

- 1.1 All Parties are united by common interests and objectives, and they shall establish channels of communication and co-operation that will promote and advance their respective operations within the Institution and its related wings. The Parties shall keep each other informed of potential opportunities and shall share all information that may be relevant to secure additional academic opportunities for one another.
- 1.2 Cooperation among all Parties will facilitate effective utilization of the intellectual capabilities of the faculty of all Parties providing significant inputs to them in developing suitable teaching/training systems, keeping in mind the needs of all Parties and their students.
- 1.3 The general terms of co-operation shall be governed by this MOU. The Parties shall cooperate with each other and shall, as promptly as is reasonably practical, enter into all relevant agreements, deeds, and documents (the 'Definitive Documents') as may be required to give effect to the actions contemplated in terms of this MOU. The term of Definitive Documents shall be mutually decided between the Parties. Along with the Definitive Documents, this MOU shall represent the entire understanding as to the subject matter hereof and shall supersede any prior understanding between the Parties on the subject matter hereof.

CLAUSE 2 SCOPE OF THE MoU

- 2.1 The budding graduates from the institutions are in immediate need of skills that cannot be imparted by the mainstream curricular courses offered in all institutions part of this multilateral MoU. All Parties believe that close co-operation among them would be of major benefit to the student community to enhance their skills and knowledge.
- 2.2 Curriculum Design: All Parties will give valuable inputs to plan teaching/training methodology and suitably customize the curriculum so that the students benefit from the courses when they enter the workspace.
- 2.3 Human Resources: All Parties will distribute the course teaching load among themselves and provide the necessary training resources so that the courses can be completed within the stipulated time.

- 2.4 All Parties to obtain all internal approvals, consents, permissions, and licenses of whatsoever nature required for offering the Programmes on the terms specified herein.
- 2.5 There is no financial commitment on the part of any Party included in this multilateral MoU.
 If there is any financial consideration, it will be dealt with separately.

CLAUSE 3 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

3.1 Nothing contained in this MOU shall, by express grant, implication, estopped or otherwise, create in any Party any right, title, interest, or license in or to the intellectual property (including but not limited to know-how, curriculum designs, course content) of all Parties.

CLAUSE 4 VALIDITY

- 4.1 This Agreement will be valid until it is expressly terminated by either Party on mutually agreed terms, during which period all Parties, as the case may be, will take effective steps for implementation of this MOU. Any act on the part of any Party, after the termination of this Agreement by way of communication, correspondence etc., shall not be construed as an extension of this MOU
 - 4.2 Any Party may terminate this MOU upon 7 calendar days' notice in writing. In the event of Termination, all parties have to discharge their obligations

CLAUSE 5 RELATIONSHIP AMONG THE PARTIES

- 5.1 It is expressly agreed that All Parties are acting under this MOU as independent entities, and the relationship established under this MOU shall not be construed as a partnership. Neither Party is authorized to use the other Parties' names in any way, to make any representations or create any obligation or liability, expressed or implied, on behalf of the other Parties, without the prior written consent of the other Parties. Neither Party shall have, nor represent itself as having, any authority under the terms of this MOU to make agreements of any kind in the names of or binding upon the other Parties, to pledge the other Parties' credit, or to extend credit on behalf of the other Parties.
- Any divergence or difference derived from the interpretation or application of the MoU shall be resolved by informal discussion among all parties involved. This MoU will not be used for the purpose of any litigation in the future

Charles Wallace India Trust (CWIT) Visiting Fellowship 2021 – 2022 at the Institute of Advanced Studies in the Humanities (IASH), University of Edinburgh

Congratulations! I am delighted that you have been selected for the Charles Wallace India Trust IASH fellowship and that you are planning to be in Edinburgh from January - April 2022.

I am writing to confirm the terms of the offer. As you will know, CWIT will give you a monthly stipend of £1,400 to cover accommodation costs and all other living expenses, for the duration of the fellowship i.e four months. This stipend is payable through the IASH. We will also contribute £600 **towards** the cost of your international flight (the actual cost may be higher or lower).

Please note that CWIT will <u>not</u> be able to offer you any additional funding to that set out in this letter. It is your responsibility to plan in advance and ensure that you have sufficient funds to cover all of your living and other necessary expenses e.g PCR Covid tests, for the entirety of your stay in the UK.

Please also note that by accepting this offer, you agree that CWIT <u>does not</u> owe you a duty of care of any kind, and in particular, though not limited to, in cases of emergency, accident, injury or illness, should any occur to you during your stay in the UK. To that extent, we would advise that, prior to your arrival in the UK, you ensure that you have the necessary means to undertake your research in the UK for the entirety of its duration and have taken out all necessary insurance policies, including health insurance and travel insurance.

We further advise that, due to the <u>COVID19 global pandemic</u>, you stay informed as to the current situation in the UK and make sure that, <u>prior to your arrival</u>, <u>you are aware of any relevant risks</u>, <u>travel restrictions</u>, <u>and/or changes to your fellowship programme</u>, as applicable at the time.

The conditions of the fellowship grant are that:

- you must conform to the rules and regulations of the IASH and the University of Edinburgh
- you must write a brief report (maximum 3 or 4 pages of A4 paper), for the CWIT trustees within two months of completing your fellowship and returning to India.
