ONE-DAY SEMINAR ON FRENCH LITERATURE, TRANSLATION AND FRANCOPHONE STUDIES

The Department of French, Tagore Government Arts and Science College organized a one-day seminar on French literature, Translation and Francophone Studies on 20th April 2023 in Bharathiyar Conference Hall of the college from 2-6 P.M. The chief guest for the seminar was Prof. Dr. Alain Désoulières (R.) from National Institue of Orientanal Languages and cultures (INALCO), Sorbonne University, France. The seminar focussed on the contemporary research trends in the domaine of French Literature, Translation and Francophone Studies and included the following presentations by four ressource persons:

- 1. Prof. Dr. Alain Désoulières (Retd.), ILANCO, Sorbonne Université Paris Cité, Paris, France : "Traduction, adaptation, intermédialité : le cas de Guy de Maupassant."
- 2. Dr. Ritu Tyagi, Asst. Prof. of French, Department of French and Francophone Studies, Pondicherry University, Puducherry: "L'île Maurice dans l'œuvre de Ananda Devi"
- 3. Dr.Milind Dongre, Asst. Prof. of French Avvaiyar Govt. College for Women, Karaikal: "Être français et littérature de banlieue"
- 4. Dr. Alok Pathak, Asst. Prof. of French SMVEC, Madagadipet, Puducherry: "Paris imaginé par Patrick Modiano."

The seminar was attended by approximately 60 students from departments of French TGASC, Pondicherry University and SMVEC Madagadipet. It was an enriching session where students got the opportunity to listen to experts in the domaine of French and Francophone studies from France and different instituions of Pondicherry.

The presentations of the seminar introduced the key concepts of translation and adaptation Studies, francophone literature, narratology, "banlieue literature" and memory studies which will be immensely beneficial to students in their higher studies and research in French and Francophone studies.

Annebaressou made the welcome address, Principal Dr. Sasi Kanta Dash made the presidential address, Prof. Dr. Alain Désoulières did the inaugural address and Ms Bhawan Singhmar, Asst. 
