Tagore Arts College, Established in the year 1961, is the premier institution in the Union Territory of Puducherry. Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru laid the foundation stone for the new campus of our College on the Birth Centenary of our patron Shri Rabindranath Tagore. In a span of 50 years, it has blossomed into a full fledged institution offering courses in a wide range of disciplines at the Graduate level. The College has earned the honour of being recognized as a quality institution by the University of Madras. From the academic year 86-87, the College was affiliated to the Pondicherry University. From 1986-90 it is functioning as an Under-Graduate Institution only. Our College has been accredited with B+ Grade (Score 77.25%) equivalent to Five Star by the NAAC.

Development of Tagore Arts College, Puducherry indicating the Physical Targets proposed during the current financial year 2011-12.

The Scheme "Development of Tagore Arts College, Puducherry" envisages the development and strengthening of the TAC, Puducherry by continuing the existing academic UG courses. It is proposed to introduce a new UG course BPA with the intake of 35 students and a P.G. Course M.A. Classical Tamil, providing additional infrastructural facilities, creating more faculty positions and supporting staff etc.

During the XIth Five year Plan period 5 posts of lecturers in Tourism (BPA), 2 posts of Lecturers in Psychology, 2 posts of Lecturers in Tourism and Travel Management, 1 post of Data Entry Operator, 2 posts of Store Keeper Gr.III, 1 post of LDC, 1 post of Driver (HMV) Gr.III, 1 post of Bus Attender, 1 post of Technical Assistant to Computer Science Department, 2 posts of Lecturers in Sociology and 5 posts of Lecturers in English are proposed. Further, sufficient quantity of consumables, apparatus and equipments for laboratories, class room furniture, books for Library, hardware and software for Computer Lab etc. required for smooth functioning of the Institution were acquired.

In addition to the above, purchase of 1 Car for Principal/Office use and 1 two wheeler and to provide Intercom facilities to all the Departments of this College and to provide the air condition facilities for Office computer room to avoid the necessary prohibition in the computer room and maintenance of all the computers properly.
